You are cordially invited to enter your model(s) in the 2010 Midlands Model Engineering Exhibition. All exhibitors receive a specially designed commemorative plaque and an exhibitor's certificate. Whilst the exhibition is in progress all models will be fully insured and wherever possible all exhibits will be linked to wired alarm systems. Adequate barriers will protect all exhibits and night security will be maintained.

EXHIBITION CLASSES. The sixteen classes are divided into two sections: **Competition** which will be judged by acknowledged experts and cups, etc. awarded and **Display** where exhibitors just wishing to display their work, finished or unfinished, may do so for the enjoyment of visitors.**

PLEASE NOTE: Models entered in competition classes must be the work of the exhibitor, except in exceptional circumstances and with the prior agreement of the organiser.

Any model previously awarded 1st, 2nd or 3rd prize at the Midlands Model Engineering Exhibition may not re-enter a competition class but may be exhibited in the display class.

- Fidelity to prototype - Exhibitors should provide information on the prototype of the model with photographs or prints of the original as appropriate for the period which the model depicts wherever possible.
- Workmanship and quality of the finish
- Your current or former trade or profession

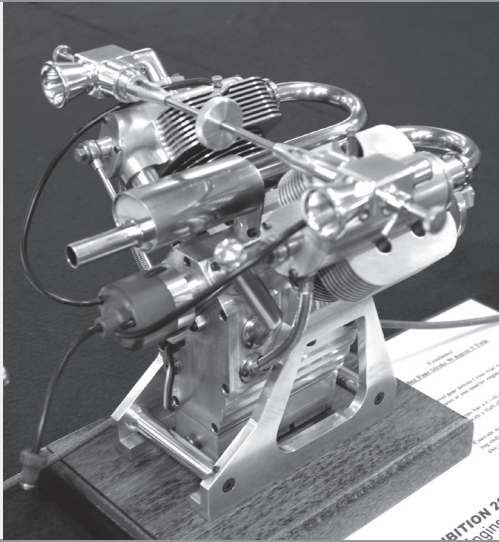

Receipts must be presented to the Organisers before models may be released at the end of the exhibition.

Competition Rules:

One Entry per form please – photocopies are acceptable.

Entries should be received by closing date – Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organiser.

Models entered in competition classes must be the work of the exhibitor, except in exceptional circumstances and with prior agreement of the organiser.

Any model previously awarded 1st, 2nd or 3rd prize at the Midlands Model Engineering Exhibition may not re-enter a competition class but may be exhibited in the display class.

Origin of design should be stated along with details of any work on the exhibit not undertaken by you, or not of your own manufacture (commercial castings, etc.)

The Judges reserve the right to move any competition entry into another class when in their opinion the model has been entered in the incorrect class.

GUIDANCE NOTES FOR EXHIBITOR COMPETITION / DISPLAY ENTRIES

Exhibition Classes:

The sixteen classes are divided into two sections:

Competition: which will be judged by acknowledged experts where trophies & shields will be awarded along with cash prizes where applicable.

Display: is for exhibitors wishing to display their work, finished or unfinished. We welcome part built models as visitors enjoy seeing work in progress and once complete, why not enter for competition?

Class 1 – Locomotives – up to & including gauge 1

Class 2 – Locomotives – 2½" & 3½" gauges

Class 3 – Locomotives – 5" & 7¼" gauges & above

Class 4 – Rolling Stock etc. any gauge

Class 5 – Stationary Engines

Class 6 – Steam Road Vehicles (static)

Class 7 – Machine Tools & Workshop Equipment

Class 8 – Internal Combustion Engines

Class 9 – Horological & Scientific

Class 10 – Marine Models – scale (over 50% scratch built)

Class 11 – Marine Model – kit (standard or modified)

Class 12 – Model Horse Drawn Vehicles

Class 13 – Scale Aircraft Models

Class 14 – Young Engineers Award (under 20 years old)

Class 15 – Miscellaneous

Class 16 – Hot Air Engines

Exhibitor Information:

There are no entry charges and cash prizes are awarded where applicable.

All exhibits are fully insured from home, travel, during the exhibition and back again.

Wherever possible all exhibits will be linked to wired alarm systems with adequate banners & night security.

All entrants will receive an attendance plaque and certificate when the model is collected after the exhibition.

All exhibitors will receive an exhibitor's pass (non transferable) and official receipt for their exhibit upon delivery either at the Exhibition or the Meridienne Office.

Receipts must be presented to the organisers before models may be released at the end of the exhibition.
